Greetings Everyone,

The warmer weather is here and the first day of summer is very near. It's a great time to soak up some fresh air and sunshine and get a little extra natural vitamin D.

It' also a time to remember to keep your birds safe and secure while outdoors. It doesn't take much for a bird to become frightened and take flight. Sometimes they just may want to fly. Once airborne, everything looks different and they may not be able to find their way back home.

Even birds with clipped flight feathers can still fly, especially cockatiels. Cockatiels are extremely strong fliers even when they are missing some of their primary flight feathers.

Watching your bird fly away is heart wrenching. Some birds are found and returned, but not all. Prevention is the best approach.

Be mindful of open windows and doors accessible to your birds. When taking your bird outdoors, use a carrier or work on getting them comfortable wearing a harness. It's worth the time and effort and can save a life and heartache.

Like the saying goes: "An ounce of prevention is worth a pound of cure". Take some time to keep your birdie safe and enjoy the summer.

HDBC Hotline



Our HDBC hotline has been fairly quiet for the end of May and early June.

We had two calls regarding wild birds. A lot of wild birds

are fledging and often look like they are in distress. Concerned people want to help. If the bird is fully-feathered, we advise they leave the bird outside and try to prevent their dogs or cats from accessing the fledgling. The fledgling's parents are usually nearby. Contact information for New Mexico Wildlife Rescue and On a Wing and a Prayer wild bird rescues was also offered.

For bird adoptions, surrenders, and lost and found birds, Birds of a Feather Parrot Rescue of NM is the go to place.

HDBC Library

We had two small crates of books left. They were donated to the Albuquerque City Library. They do not take periodicals, so we still have one crate full of Bird Talk magazines and a few other bird-related magazines.

AFA Conference



This year the AFA (American Federation of Aviculture) and the ASA (Avicultural Society of America) are combining their annual Educational Conference.

The combined conference will take place at the Hilton

Richardson, in Dallas, Texas from September 28-30, 2023.

The cost of three full days of conference, a banquet and off-site tour is quite reasonable for \$295.00. Lodging can also be secured through a link on the AFA website: Educational conference 2023 – American Federation of Aviculture (afabirds.org).

Details regarding the off-site tour are still pending and will likely be announced soon. The off-site tour during the San Antonio, TX, conference a few years ago was to the local zoo with a back-scene tour of their rare bird nursery.
