Hospitality Table




Do you like snacks? Do you like to share? HDBC invites you to share some snacks at our hospitality table at each monthly meeting.

HDBC Elections



It's that time of year again to nominate and vote for HDBC officers for the next year. In October, nominations are collected and accepted. In November,

members vote for the candidate of his or her choice.

Something noted at the AFA Conference about bird clubs that is kind of sad. When the AFA was formed in 1973, over 300 bird clubs nationwide were affiliated with it. In 2023, only 40 bird clubs remain. Many bird clubs have simply disbanded and no longer exist.

Please consider running for an officer position or working as a committee chairperson. We're a good club with a noble cause. We should continue our mission to educate and promote good and proper care of caged birds.

As a club, we also offer education and community support for current and new bird owners that adopt through Birds of a Feather Parrot Rescue.

Serving as a club officer is both challenging and rewarding. It does require some time, but it is not all consuming. The more members we have participate in leading the club, the easier it is.

PSAs

As we enter the holiday season, please do not use non-stick cookware. This includes roasters, fryers, oven bags and non-stick coated aluminum foil. All non-stick coatings are extremely toxic to our feathered friends.

Sharing is caring as long as onions, garlic and avocado are not part of the ingredients. These items are also toxic for our birds.

Sweet potatoes and baking pumpkins are healthy treats for our birds. Cooked sweet potatoes without sugar or butter are nutritious, as well as cooked or raw baking pumpkins which can double as a foraging toy.



Seasonal Changes

Daylight savings time is right around the corner on the first Sunday of November.

As we set our clocks back one hour, our birds also feel the change in season and weather.

This is a time of year when our birds require more sleep, especially cockatoos. Our bird friends with the fancy head feathers need about 10 hours of sleep each



day. It really helps them adapt to the time change and may even quell some of their excess vocalization.

Bird Rescue, Foster, and Adoption



A variety of birds are available for adoption at Birds of a Feather Parrot Rescue of New Mexico (BFPR). HDBC is partnering with BFPR to help

with receiving, fostering and rehoming pet birds.

Every year, the adoption process is paused from November 15th through January 15th. This is to discourage the gifting of birds as Christmas or other holiday presents.

If an adoption is already in progress prior to November 15th, that adoption can continue to completion.

The rescue is at capacity and a waiting list for

surrenders is in place for other than emergency situations.
