
Participation is optional, but please bring a gift if you want to participate in the exchange.

It was then that I noticed the Senegal staring, as his eyes flashed with anger I saw he was glaring


Towards the side of the room at an overturned pail. I followed his gaze and saw a flash of white tail.

Every year, the adoption process is

paused from November 15th through January 15th. This is to discourage the gifting of birds as Christmas or other holiday presents.

If an adoption is already in progress prior to November 15th, that adoption can continue to completion.

The rescue is at capacity and a waiting list for surrenders is in place for other than emergency situations.


